

Our Library's New Look

To say we've had a busy summer would be an understatement. In addition to using our summer months to complete projects and plan for the coming year, we've undergone some high-impact changes – all with Clermont College students in mind.









A glimpse of the refreshed space, August 2014.

Refresh planning began in the spring after surveying Clermont College students about their library experiences and ideas to improve the space. Our students' top request? More places to charge laptops, tablets, and other electronic devices. This summer we've added more than 150 electrical outlets on the 1st and 2nd floors. Additional improvements to the library include:

- New carpeting on the 1st floor
- Fresh paint on the 1st floor
- New seating at PCs and study tables
- Improved electric access
- Lighting improvements throughout

- New periodicals shelving
- Workspace upgrades on the 2nd floor
- Improved entry signage
- New student PCs
- Student art exhibition space

iPad Reserves Program

Beginning in Fall 2014, the library will proudly circulate iPads exclusively for UC Clermont students. Since iPads are limited, we'll employ a modified reserves model to circulate them. In other words, Clermont teaching faculty may place an iPad on reserve for specific students to support a course project, available on a first-booked basis beginning Autumn 2014.

The program was initiated in collaboration with Professor Karen Lankisch, the BLT department, and Chris Borne from Technology Services. "I am delighted to add iPads to the library's

reserves collection," Public Services Manager Natalie Winland, "Libraries and technology are natural partners." The library's involvement in circulating iPads should improve access and boost usage across campus. E-Book Acquisitions

Though our library has provided access to e-books from UC Libraries for years, we're elated to announce that we'll be piloting the acquisition of e-books in late Autumn 2014. This means that when Clermont College librarians, faculty, or students request a book for our collection, they'll also have the option to choose its format – print or e-book. Working with UC Electronic Resources Librarian Sean Crowe, Clermont Library Technical Services Manager Penny McGinnis has taken the lead on this game-changing initiative. "E-books are a good move for Clermont Library," says Interim Library Director Katie Foran-Mulcahy. "In addition to providing 24-7 access to high-quality information, they also don't take up real estate like print materials. E-books allow librarians to curate high-quality collections and free up space for dynamic, 21st century student spaces."

Improved Service @ UC East



The students, faculty and staff of UC East can now get real time, one-on-one research assistance from a reference librarian one of two ways – via web conferencing or in-person by appointment. The new service initiative will improve access to reference services at UC East. "We'll come to you," says librarian Kathi Epperson, coordinator of the new initiative. "Skype, Lync, or in person – we remain committed to serving the students and faculty at UC East." The library will retain its space in 182C for these in-person appointments and for student-librarian web conferencing in collaboration with Jason Shoemake and Ali Bahar of Clermont's Technology Services department.
